Bill Boyar welcomed the board. Mr. Boyar gave a special welcome to newly elected board member Peter Brodsky.

Gretchen Miller spoke about her experience at the 2018 KIPP Austin High School graduation and reminded the board that we are building community for students, families and staff.

KIPP Texas Academic Performance Report - Public Hearing

Daphane Carter provided the KIPP Texas Academic Performance Report for school year 18-19. Key takeaways included we doubled the number of A and B schools, we have 4 schools in improvement required, we need to continue to focus on paving the college and career path for students with disabilities, and we are retaining more teachers in the 3-5 year experience mark.

CEO Report

Sehba Ali spoke on current KIPP Texas wins in academics, integration and culture. Ms. Ali also detailed critical issues for KIPP Texas including student engagement (recruitment, enrollment and attendance), fundraising and driving academic performance (rigor and teacher capacity in priority schools).

Finance Update and Finance Work Group Update

Jaideep Hebbar provided an update on KIPP Texas' financial health. The organization is currently in a strong financial position. Mr. Hebbar shared areas of focus for the remainder of the school year: ADA variances, development revenue, compensatory education funding formula shifts under HB3, and the development of the 20-21 school year Budget.

Strategic Initiatives

Board member Ethan Phillips, Jaideep Hebbar, and Erin Slezak discussed the five main areas of focus for the strategic initiatives. These areas included learning experiences with high rigor and low variability, alumni success, talent, growth and community engagement, and operational excellence. The internal and external process for feedback that helped to develop these strategic initiatives was also explained. Input from this feedback included desire for equitable facilities, better preparation for the world beyond KIPP (life skills, financial literacy, etc.), and stronger teacher and staff development. Mr Hebbar explained if we get these priorities right in five years all KIPP Texas schools will be academically excellent. After much discussion on academic variability, goal setting, mission, metrics for success and growth, the Board agreed to continue the conversation on strategic initiatives and how we talk about KTX (metrics, mission, etc.) as a part of the April Board meeting and All Board Offsite meeting in April.

Student Recruitment

Board member Munira Fareed introduced Tiana Symmonds, Managing Director of Operations . Ms. Symmonds spoke on the recruitment process, what KIPP Texas is doing to cultivate and retain students, as well as the current state of student attrition/retention. Recruitment wins were shared including pre-kindergarten enrollment in Austin and Kindergarten recruitment events in Houston. Ms. Symmonds also discussed opportunities for growth in recruitment.

Development Update and Development Work Group Update

Ann Scott began her presentation with an acknowledgement of Board member support with development efforts. Ms. Scott spoke on development strategy, the Houston and Austin advance work as well as an ask of Board members for support on the campaign, help with reviewing prospects and encouraging network motivation.

Advocacy Update

Bill Boyar introduced the new KIPP Texas Deputy Chief of Advocacy, Addie Gomez. Ms. Gomez spoke on her background in advocacy and her connection with education organizations. Ms. Gomez presented an initial advocacy strategy for KIPP Texas. This approach includes legislative advocacy, building out the advocacy team in each region, grass tops legislative work with regional boards, and developing parents and alumni as advocates.

On motion by Jayshree Desai, seconded by Gretchen Miller, the Board unanimously approved Delegation of Authority to the Executive Committee for one real estate acquisition and related actions and one campus and building development project, and including but not limited to reviewing and ranking proposals, and selecting, negotiating, and awarding contracts as more specifically stated in the Resolution for purchase of 2700 Simpson Street property in Dallas.

Approval of KTX Transportation RFP recommendation

Approval of Delegation of Authority to the Executive Committee for KTX Transportation RFP recommendation After discussion Bill Boyar proposed to delegate authority to the Executive Committee for the transportation RFP recommendation and asked that additional information regarding cost and savings be provided. Mr. Boyar also requested that the contract be fully vetted by counsel.
